After a SNAC record is published, images can be linked/imported from [Wikimedia Commons](#)

The publication step is the step that gives the SNAC record its permanent **Ark ID**, and that's what's required for connecting to Wikidata.

2. If there is an image already in the Wikidata item, you're set. If there is no image, you'll need to check Wikimedia Commons or upload an image to Commons (if possible)

*Note:* You do not need to be logged into Wikidata or create an account. It is recommended to do so; more information is [here](#).

- No one has uploaded one into Wikidata
- There is no image in Wikimedia Commons
