Editing Principle statement

The SNAC Editorial Policy and Standards Working Group submitted a draft SNAC "Editing Principle" to the Operations Committee. The intention behind the statement is simply to describe the intellectual and ethical approach of description of Corporate Bodies, Persons, and Families in SNAC, and to post the statement on the SNAC Website. The Operations Committee submitted the document to the Cooperative Members for review from the period of March 12 - March 23.

Technology Development Update

Updated resource “cache” handling will be available this month on <http://snac-dev.iath.virginia.edu/> and rolling out to the production website soon. Currently, an editor can add a new resource when creating the resource relation in a constellation, but cannot edit the information about the resource after creation. The technology team is currently cleaning data and testing the ability to search for and update resources outside of the normal Constellation edit page. This update will also show which Constellations are designated as holding repositories in SNAC.

The technology team has rolled out some new features to <http://snaccooperative.org/> over the past few weeks:

- An upgraded messaging center
- The renaming of “HRT” view to “Simplified View.”
- OSTicket support center integration to make feedback and contact form submissions simpler and more efficient

Finally, there have been some good real-world tests of the SNAC rest API over the past few weeks, including participation in a hackathon at UVA in which one team used the SNAC API in building an Amazon Alexa skill to search SNAC.

The Communications Working Group met on March 12 to continue work on the official SNAC Powerpoint presentation that members will be asked to refer to when presenting about SNAC. The next meeting is scheduled for April 9, when the working group plans to finalize the draft to submit to the Operations Committee for approval.
