SNAC Stats

The following includes general statistical information about use of SNAC's research portal.

As of reporting time (Tuesday, May 25, 2021), there were 3,723,659 identity constellations and 2,102,350 resource descriptions in SNAC. In the past month, SNAC had over 70,000 users and referred over 4,300 visitors to holding institutions' sites.
