The Technical working group and development team recently completed a major cleanup of over 185,000 duplicate CPFs. The process involved querying for CPFs with a high likelihood of duplication by name and reviewing candidates before programmatically merging records. This process will greatly decrease duplication in SNAC and improve data quality.
