Notes and Examples:

ownerOf/ownedBy: reserved for enslaved people and enslavers

Enslavers can be both persons and corporate bodies; Enslaved can be both persons and families

Examples: Quander Family **ownedBy** Washington, George, 1732-1799
Washington, Martha, 1731-1802 **ownerOf** Quander, Nancy Carter

successorOf/predecessorOf: reserved for corporate bodies

Example: United States. National Aeronautics and Space Administration successorOf United States. National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics

memberOf/hasMember: for persons and corporate bodies, like organizations or expeditions Examples: Baffin Island Expedition (1927) hasMember Bartlett, Bob, 1875-1946 Reagan, Ronald, 1911-2004 memberOf Republican Party (U.S.: 1854-)
